PHASE 3 TEMPORARY FOOD EVENT GUIDELINES (6/1/2020)

PHASE 1 (RAPID SPREAD) and PHASE 2 (FLATTENING): Temporary Food Events are Not Allowed

PHASE 3 (RECOVERY): Peoria City/County Health Department will begin issuing Temporary Food Event Licenses that Meet the Following Guidelines on June 1, 2020:

- Must be associated with an event
- Event is limited to number of persons allowed per local municipality and state guidelines for gatherings in the current phase (see: Restore HOI and Restore Illinois Plans)
- Only carryout, drive-thru, curbside pickup, or delivery is allowed for Temporary Food Vendors operating out of a tent or non-permanent structure that is not equipped with floors, walls, ceiling, plumbing, electricity, etc.
- Outdoor seating *may* be allowed for Temporary Food Vendors operating out of a permanent structure, i.e., brick and mortar building equipped with floors, walls, ceiling, plumbing, electricity, etc., as long as the guidelines set forth in the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) document “Restaurants and Bars (outdoor dining and drinking guidelines), as well as the guidelines set forth in the City of Peoria document “Temporary Outdoor Restaurant and Bar Guidance,” and/or local municipality guidelines (if not in City of Peoria) are followed
- Single-vendor events ONLY (example: fish fry fundraiser, pancake breakfast, porkchop dinner)
- No self-service areas or pre-stocked tables (including condiments, napkins, beverages, silverware)
- Encourage pre-ordering to help control crowds
- Social distancing guidelines must be followed, i.e., lines marked to indicate 6’ separation in the pickup/carryout/order lines. Tables at least 6’ apart. No groups larger than 6 per table, etc. (See Restore HOI and Restore Illinois Plans for complete guidelines)
- Employees must wear face coverings if unable to maintain 6’ separation from each other or customers
- Must submit a plan of how employee health will be monitored and what practices will be put into place to prevent the spread of diseases during set up, operation, and cleanup of the Temporary Food Event (submit with application on a separate piece of paper or email plan to eh@peoriacounty.org along with the event name, date, and contact information)
- These rules are in addition to the Peoria City/County Health Department Temporary Food Event Rules
- Inspection may be conducted virtually or in-person
